# Summer School Highlights- 2017

Milton's Summer School Program served approximately 1604 participants in grades PreK-12. Many of these students took two enrichment courses through our summer school program. Some of these students could not be reported in our membership count, as 24 were nonresidents and 69 were open enrollment students enrolled in our classes. Last year we had 23 nonresidents and 74 open enrollment students. Our resident FTE for this year is 79. The table below illustrates the FTE over the past few years.

Every year we discontinue or cancel some courses in order to be able to add new selections. This past year, we shifted the amount of staff covering some courses in order to reallocate these funds to offer more new courses.

## 2017 Highlights:

- New approach to High School credit recovery courses implemented successfully.
- We offered 4-week enrichment and remedial summer school courses and 6-week academic make-up courses and courses for high school credit.
- Some courses run on alternative schedule such as: Jump Start to Pre-K, Band Lessons, Band Clinics, Power Volleyball, Power Gymnastics, Making the Move, High School 101, Summer Weight Training.
- Hands-on Ag course partnered with the Milton Food Pantry to plant and maintain raised bed gardens for their patrons.
- Over 100 students participated in HS Band Clinics. DPI revised membership reporting to allow unlimited minutes per day; so all band clinic minutes could be included this year.
- Summer School fun was captured and shared through district's Facebook page &
  Technology Leaders in Training course's Technology Fair was featured on a Madison news
  station.
- Families engaged by transporting students, attending Creative Dramatics performances, Arts and Crafts Gallery, the Milton West Patriotic Parade, Hands-On Ag presentations, and many other ways.

#### **Itinerary**

The students will depart Northside at 9:00 on their first day of the trip, will travel by Riteway Bus, and will engage in the activities described below upon arrival until they load the busses at 5:00 the following day. We arrive back at Northside at approximately 6:30 PM on the second day. I'd be happy to provide a detailed itinerary at your request.

Students will participate in several educational activities at Outdoor Education including:

- Touring the MacKenzie Environmental Center (logging museum, conservation museum, wildlife exhibit, nature trails, etc.)
- Participating in a classroom activity on predators and prey
- Going on a nature hike
- Participating in a Stream Study
- Participating in a woodcutting activity
- Creating skits
- · Sing along at a campfire
- Team building activities

## Financial Plan

The District pays each staff member a stipend to teach at Outdoor Education as well as a stipend to the coordinators, as outlined in the Appendix D of the Teacher Handbook. Each student pays a \$57 fee to attend Outdoor Education. This covers the cost of the busses, food, and lodging for the trip. Students bring the money to school and the classroom teachers follow the district money-handling guidelines to record moneys collected. Fees are then deposited into the District's Outdoor Education Fees account.

Students may bring money along to purchase a souvenir (sweatshirt, hat, postcard, etc.). With the exception of the stipends, the costs for this field trip are accounted for in the Northside Building Budget. These expenses include paying for the food to be delivered to MacKenzie and supplies for lessons, for an estimated total of \$300. The Friends of Northside, our parent organization, provides scholarships to the students who cannot afford the \$57.00 fee.

Thank you for your consideration of this proposal. We are all excited about this opportunity to provide this hands-on learning experience for our sixth graders.
